# 1. INTRODUCTION TO THE SITE AREA

Maluti-a-Phofung Local Municipality is situated in the Thabo Mofutsanyana District of the Free State Province. It was established in 2000 and is named after the Drakensberg Mountains (known as “Maluti” in Sesotho. The peak in Qwaqwa is known as the Sentinel is called “Phofung” in Sesotho.

Maluti includes the towns of Harrismith and Kestell as well as the former homeland of QwaQwa, whose capital was Phuthaditjhaba. Today Phuthaditjhaba is Maluti’s administrative seat and QwaQwa residents account for 80% of the total municipal population, the majority coming from families forcibly removed from what was the Orange Free State in the 1970s and 1980s. In terms of area covered, Maluti is the smallest local municipality in the district municipality, but because of its apartheid-era history, it has the densest population and the deepest poverty.

The table below,<sup>1</sup> which compares 2011 with 2016, gives the main demographics for the municipality and shows how it is struggling to match service delivery improvements with the growth in population. Service provision is hampered by the mountainous land and remoteness of many homes.

Eighty-three percent of the population is Sesotho speaking and 11% Zulu speaking, with a small number of Afrikaans (2%) and English (1.5%) speaking inhabitants. Incomes, including social grants, are R1 600 or less per month for almost 85% of individuals, of whom 50% earn R400 or less per month.<sup>2</sup> Government is the largest single employer in the municipal area (28%), with the agriculture and the retail sectors also important employers and drivers of the local economy.

Implementation of the CWP in Maluti-a-Phofung began in 2010 as part of government's efforts to alleviate poverty in the area. What were formerly two CWP sites, one in QwaQwa and another in Harrismith, were combined in 2014 to form the current site.

## 2. SITE INFORMATION

There are 2 500 participant places budgeted for this site, of which 94% are for regular participants working 100 days per year, or 8 days a month from January to October, and 10 days each in November and December. The remaining 6% of places are allocated to supervisors and storekeepers who work 20 days every month. This site has a larger allocation than the average, due firstly to the combining of the two original sites and secondly in acknowledgement of the greater than average need of the area.

To compensate for days lost due to casual absenteeism and participants leaving the programme during the year, and to ensure that the full wage allocation is benefitting the community, the site aims to be over-recruited by 10%, bringing the total to 2 750.

In terms of demographics, youth participation (16-35 year olds) is 40%, female participation is 74% and participation by people living with disabilities is 1%. These figures are comparable to those for the CWP nationally, where youth participation is 39%, female participation is 77% and participation by people with disabilities is 1%.

The table below shows how the participation targets are distributed across the wards. Every ward in the municipality has a CWP presence.

### 3. USEFUL WORK

The concept of ‘useful work’, i.e. work that produces outputs that benefit the community, is a key feature of the CWP and much effort is expended every year in consultations, especially with community members, participants and community representatives, to identify community needs, including those that are unfunded or underfunded mandates of the Integrated Development Plan that are appropriate and feasible for the programme to address. The site is active in all pillars of CWP work. General life skills training is provided to participants, as well as training relevant to the sectors they work in. During the past three years a number of special projects have also been initiated.

#### Food and Nutrition Security Support

- Community vegetable gardens are established in the grounds of schools, crèches, old age homes and clinics

- Vegetables from the community gardens are utilised by the institutions to provide for their needs and excess produce is distributed to the vulnerable and destitute

#### **Environmental Programmes**

- Illegal dump sites are cleared
- Legal dump sites are created where refuse can be dumped

#### **Maintenance Tasks**

- The use of derelict buildings is secured from the municipality and these buildings are renovated by CWP participants as multi-purpose centres or CWP sub-site offices
- The fencing around sites where community gardens are established is repaired and maintained
- Maintenance is carried out on the homes of vulnerable community members
- Maintenance is carried out on the buildings of sites that house community gardens

#### **Support to Schools**

- CWP provides school patrols and assist learners to cross open areas where dangers may lurk
- Crèches are assisted with playing and reading to the children and with their general care
- Vegetable gardens are established at schools
- Schools are cleaned, minor repairs carried out and general maintenance provided
- Assist with soup kitchens

#### **Urban Renewal Activities**

- Parks are created and open spaces enclosed

#### **Home-based Care and Auxiliary Care Services**

- Participants visit the homes of the elderly residents, ill and vulnerable community members to cook and clean
  - Sick and weak patients are accompanied to their clinic appointments
  - Medication is collected from the clinics for the elderly residents and incapacitated
  - People are referred to government and social support services for assistance with birth
- Various health awareness campaigns are conducted

#### **Arts and Handicrafts**

- At the Multi-Purpose centres the participants are given the opportunity to develop their artistic skills in the making of various arts and crafts objects
- Participants bake, cook and preserve vegetables
- Sewing Teams make the uniforms for the home- and community-based care workers and sew garments for ECD centres and orphanages
- Knitting Teams design and produce blankets for crèches and the elderly residents, and warm clothes for children

## 4. SPECIAL PROJECTS

### Nal'ibali Reading for Enjoyment Campaign

The CWP participants in partnership with Nal'ibali are conducting reading clubs in ECD's and crèches. This intervention has yielded good results in most of the ECD's the site works with, where reading clubs have been formed. CWP participants have been trained to deliver these services to the ECD's on a daily basis and the programme has set aside a budget to ensure quality engagements.

Across the site in Harrismith, Tshiame and QwaQwa more than 200 children are benefiting from this intervention since it started in 2015.

In the Harrismith sub-site, particularly Intabazwe Township, an after school reading club has been established, which is most effective during school holidays. It assists in instilling good values in children and keeps them busy and safe, away from the streets.



### White House Multipurpose Centre

The White House Multipurpose Centre is located in the Harrismith sub-site at Intabazwe Township. The building once housed ANC offices but was abandoned following vandalism and fell into serious disrepair. In 2014 the site proposed to the municipality that the CWP take it over, renovate and repair it, and establish a multi-purpose centre to benefit the community. Following the granting of permission renovations began and continued through the following year. From 2016 the White House has been up and running.

The project aims to develop entrepreneurial skills and assist people with their initiatives to transform their lives for themselves and their families. A key feature of the work is the incubation of co-operative businesses.

CWP participants based at the White House implement projects that benefit indigent community members and the institutions that they support. These focus on handicrafts, renovations, baking and





food security. Over time it is aimed to widen the impact to the nearby community so that more people can improve their skills and be assisted to start their own enterprises.

### **White House co-operative incubator projects**

There are four co-operative groups currently being incubated as start-up businesses. The group members have received general co-op training as well as training relevant to their specific sector and are being supported with business mentoring as they develop. It is envisaged that they will require support for 2-3 years before they will be able to operate independently. In the meantime, they work with CWP assets as participants engaged in useful work.

**Construction Team** - Is responsible for renovation and for providing maximum security thereby ensuring safety of equipment, tools and utensils. The Team fitted facias and ceilings, installed plumbing, renovated the roof, fitted burglar bars on windows and doors, installed a water harvesting mechanism and water storage tanks, established a nursery tunnel and made long tables for the bakery.



**Bakery Team** - Started immediately after the renovation was completed. It provides breakfast to the surrounding community. At 08h00 in the morning CWP participants, community members and visitors to the clinic are queuing outside for fat-cakes, scones and buns. The bakery also provides the tuck shops with orders and individuals who want special cakes throughout the day.





**Food Security Team-** The Team works hard to provide nutritional food to the community and to patients visiting the nearby clinic. The food garden produces a variety of vegetables of which some are distributed to the needy, some are cooked for feeding schemes and the rest is preserved and stored for the winter months. Participants and the community are encouraged to preserve all excess vegetables that are produced, and they learn bottling and drying techniques.



**Sewing and Knitting Teams** – For more than a year now the Sewing Team has been producing uniforms for Home-Based Care participants and altering CWP uniforms too small to fit larger participants.

It will soon embark on special designing and sewing of traditional Sotho and Zulu wear, preparatory to forming a cooperative.

The Knitting Team's activities include the knitting of blankets for distribution on Mandela Day and hats, scarves and other winter garments for the elderly residents and the very young.



### Adult Education School

The school started in September 2016 with 38 participants who cannot read or write. Classes are conducted by a CWP participant who has a Higher Certificate in Adult Basic Education & Training (ABET), Ms. Nomoya Wielminah Buthelezi. She was selected through interviews organised by the site

manager, Carl Maluleke. Participants are trained to NQF Level 2, and the first proud graduates received their certificates in March 2017.

Ms Buthelezi is very excited about the opportunity presented to her to gain experience as a teacher. She believes that this programme is changing people's lives and she's honoured to be part of it. There are some participants who have never attended school at all; the site hopes that it will be able to continue offering this programme over the coming years.



### Kestell Site Office



The CWP has renovated two buildings in Kestell. One was a municipal office opposite the police station burned and vandalized by the community before 2009. The building is now used as a CWP sub-site office. It also is extended to accommodate extra rooms for disadvantaged learners to be assisted with their home work by CWP participants and to provide after school care with a soup kitchen.

A vegetable garden and a nursery and seedling germination tunnel have been established.

Opposite the CWP office is the community hall which has also been renovated and is now used by the community and CWP for meetings and special gatherings.



## Two Roomed House

The Community Work Programme changed the life of an unemployed female single parent living with her two children in a one-room mud house in Monontsha Village. The condition of the house was very bad and CWP donated building material and provided labour to build a two-room house. The house was completed and handed over to the family during Mandela Day 2016. The event was attended by the Chief and the ward and PR councillors.

The participants gained valuable experience in undertaking and completing this task, and now are able to offer similar support to others.

## Disabled Home and Crèche

During 2015/2016 the Community Work Programme renovated the Bophelong Centre of Hope, a home for community members with disabilities and a crèche. The project is situated in ward 16, Makeneng Cluster. CWP participants from ward 16, with the guidance of the IA's technical support unit, successfully completed the following work:

- Installing of new roof and ceiling
- Fencing of the centre
- Installing of doors and windows
- Plastering and painting of the centre
- Installing of water storage tanks for water harvesting
- Construction of the nursery

The renovated centre was officially handed over in July 2016 as part of the Mandela Day celebrations. The Sewing and Knitting Teams also supported the event by providing blankets and toys for the Centre's beneficiaries.





## Health Services

Together with Right to Care, which is the Lead Partner for the Provincial Department of Health Partnership Health Service Delivery programme, 12 participants were trained in Counselling and HIV Testing. With this technical skill, the participants have been deployed to assist in the local Primary Health Facilities in Harrismith and Tshiame with HIV and TB screening. They counsel patients, do finger pricking and testing and assist with the medication and the ART Adherence Clubs. The Health Team held an AIDS Day for the inmates at the Harrismith Prison in December 2016. Right to Care trained one HTS Counsellor in conducting ART Adherence Clubs.

In Harrismith, the Health Team assists in an old age home with services to the elderly residents. They conduct health talks and physical exercise sessions and give massages. They also ensure adherence to medication for non-communicable diseases, collecting patients' medication and assisting with regular check-ups on their consumption of the prescribed dosages.

The Team is currently working in the district contributing to the UNAIDS and South African HTS Policy and its goal of 90% of the community testing and knowing their status, 90% of people who test positive receiving treatment and 90% in treatment having a suppressed viral load. They have been assigned the community tertiary institution to work with, focusing mainly on students. The process of establishing the relationship with the Free State University and the Maluti TVET wellness units was graced by a warm welcome and through this engagement a relationship with the Higher Education HIV and AIDS unit was also established. Prospects of advancing the relationships are high.



## 5. LOCAL REFERENCE COMMITTEE

Programme implementation is supported by the Local Reference Committee. The current committee was appointed following the local government elections in 2016. It includes five representatives from the municipality, four Community Development Workers, representation from the Traditional Authority, and representatives from the faith-based and NGO sectors.

The committee exercises oversight as well as being a source of advice and practical assistance to the site management. The current members are shown in the table below.
